Our level of production at our hatcheries would not be possible without this extra ordinary effort that comes from our community and volunteers.

In May we spent most of our time rearing, transporting and releasing our fish.

As the Chinook smolted at Duck Lake Hatchery we released them and made room for additional Chinook that were transported from our Mill hatchery.

Water Quality data collection continued with biweekly sampling of the Lang Creek Watershed). Routine sampling includes a test for color, pH, turbidity, temperature, salinity flow, and general weather conditions. The information is collected and used to compile an annual report.
